

**A 2+2 Articulation Agreement
Leading to a Bachelor of Arts**

Seton Hill University

And

Westmoreland County Community College

To afford students the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice utilizing coursework from Westmoreland County Community College (WCCC) and Seton Hill University (SHU).

Articulation/Transfer Agreement between Seton Hill University and Westmoreland County Community College.

To afford students the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice utilizing coursework from Westmoreland County Community College (WCCC) and Seton Hill University (SHU).

Benefits to students

1. Students will complete 60 - 62 transferrable credits of coursework at WCCC at their tuition rates (Criminal Justice, Associate of Arts or Criminal Justice, Associate of Applied Science).
2. Students will then be able to transfer into SHU and complete the remaining 60 credits of an undergraduate Bachelor of Arts degree seamlessly over four semesters.
3. A minimum of half of the required major credits will be taken at SHU. Transfer students must earn a minimum of 48 Seton Hill credits (with the completion of the major and Liberal Arts Curriculum) to be considered for a baccalaureate degree.
4. A grid of specific WCCC courses that will transfer toward the Criminal Justice program at SHU has been developed.
5. The following WCCC courses are approved as transferrable to the SHU Liberal Arts Curriculum:
 - a. ENG 161 College Writing (Composition and Culture)
 - b. ENG 164 Advanced Composition (Composition and Culture)
 - c. CRJ 296 Criminalistics (Science)
 - d. MTH 161 Modern College Mathematics (Mathematics)
 - e. MUS 155 Music Listening (Artistic Expression)

The following WCCC courses for the Criminal Justice - Associate of Applied Science program are approved by the SHU Criminal Justice Faculty as equivalent courses in the SHU Criminal Justice major.

The SHU transcript for the baccalaureate degree will reflect letter grades for all course completed at WCCC.

Proposed changes for program implementation

1. SHU requests that WCCC include a statement describing the Articulation Agreement in the WCCC catalog.
2. SHU will track and report data to WCCC about students who complete the baccalaureate program in Criminal Justice.
3. SHU will review each incoming student's advising needs to assure full support for retention and success.

Terms and Conditions

1. Individual course grades from WCCC must be C- or better in order for those courses to be imported to SHU. Both credits and grades will transfer. Grades imported will be computed in the SHU cumulative grade point average.
2. In order to be formally admitted into the SHU program, WCCC students must have a cumulative average of a 2.0 by the end of their two years at WCCC.
3. WCCC students complete the application through the Transfer Office, and an updated official transcript from WCCC is required for transfer credit evaluation.
4. Both institutions will be responsible for notifying the other party in writing of changes in the curriculum, academic standards, and other changes that may affect this agreement.
5. The provisions of this articulation agreement do not imply that students who do not sign a letter of intent at matriculation at WCCC in the recognized transfer program are precluded from applying to SHU as a transfer student.
6. This agreement will be effective, once signed, and shall automatically be renewed from year to year with such changes, if any, as are mutually agreed upon in writing by Seton Hill University and Westmoreland County Community College. Either party upon one calendar year's notice may terminate the agreement. A request for termination must be made in writing.
7. An outline of transferrable courses is attached.
